ABOUT PEALS BOARD

All states, jurisdictions, and territories of the United States have established engineering, architecture, landscape architecture and land surveying Boards. The Guam Board carries out its mission through the regulation of the practice of these professions by:

- Ensuring that those entering the practice meet minimum standards of competency by way of education, experience and examination;
- Requiring that any person or firms practicing or offering to practice engineering, architecture, landscape architecture, land surveying and construction management services be licensed;
- Establishing standards of practice for those licensed to practice; and enforcing the laws, codes, and standards governing engineering, architecture, landscape architecture and land surveying practices in a fair and professional manner.

OPERATION STRUCTURE

The PEALS Board is composed of seven (7) members, at least two (2) being female, to be constituted as follows: five (5) members who shall be registered under the provisions of 22 GCA, Chapter 32, the Director of Public Works and one (1) member of the general public. Except for the Director of Public Works, a member shall be appointed by the governor of Guam for a term of four (4) years. Of the five (5) registered professional members, two (2) shall be architects, of which one (1) may be a landscape architect, two (2) shall be engineers, and one (1) shall be a land surveyor.

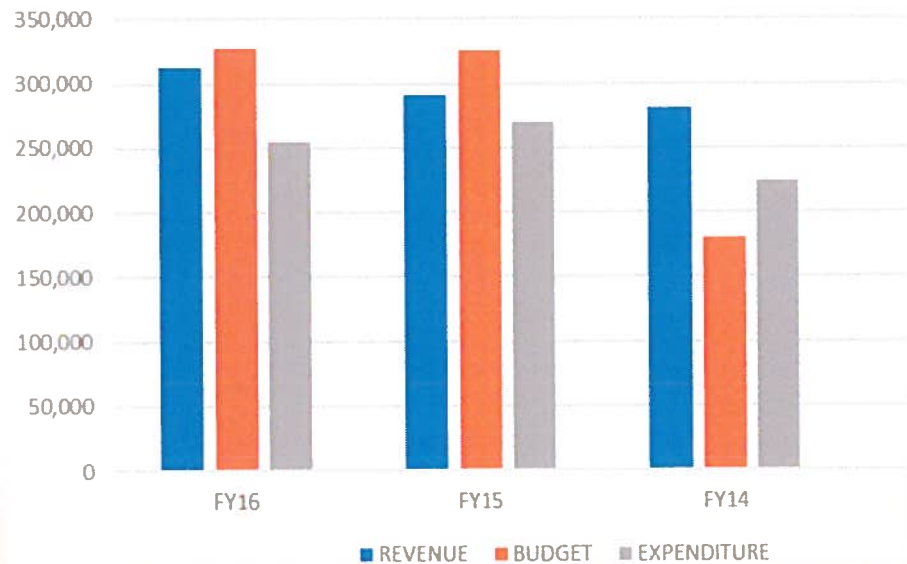


OUR FINANCES

The Board's main sources of revenue are fees from applications, registrations and permit clearances. All revenue received by the Board is remitted to the Treasurer of Guam for credit to the PEALS Board's fund account. In 2008, the Board established and maintained a Revolving Fund Account as authorized by Section 32109 (k) P.L. 30-55, which will be maintained as an escrow account for direct deposit of garnished wages and to make vendor payments where the requisition process through the Dept. of Administration takes more time than allowed.

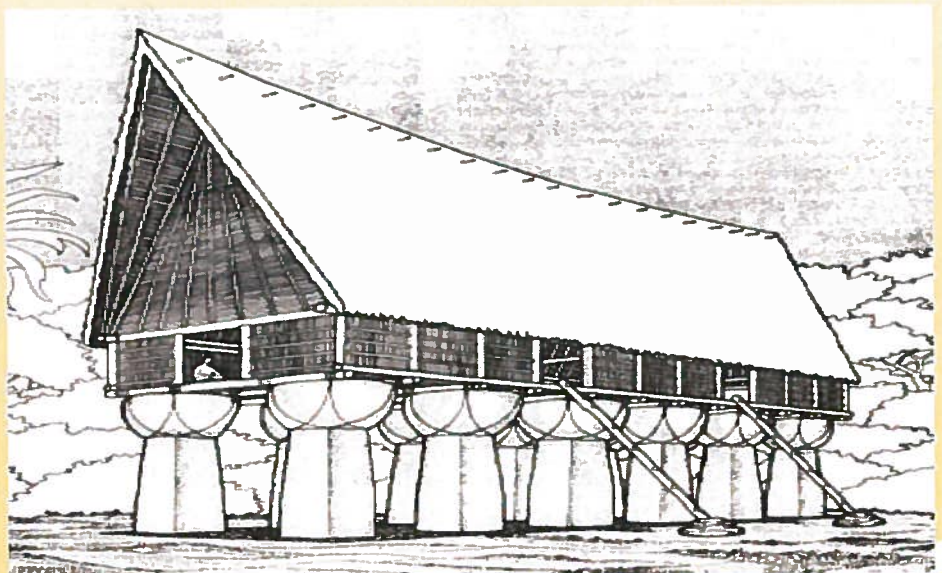

The PEALS Board was audited earlier this year by the Office of Public Accountability (OPA). If you want to read the whole report, you can log on to the OPA website.

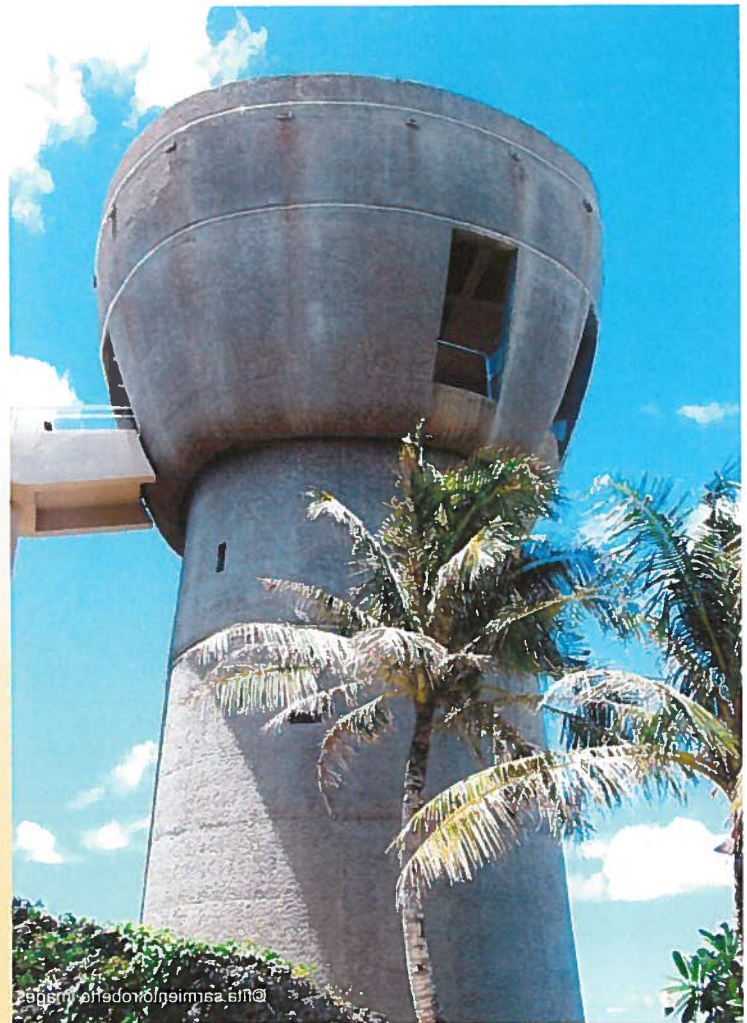


FUTURE CHALLENGES:

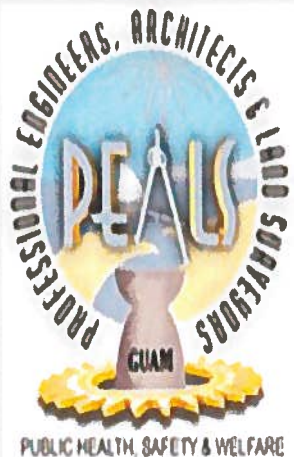
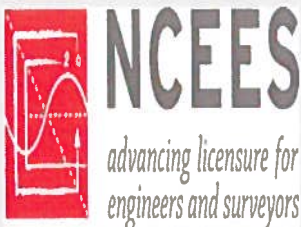
- Improve operations to include possible online renewal process for licensee and increase license renewal period from 1 to 2 years
